Alberta government news and events September 9, 2016

Construction is starting on a new facility that will serve Calgary families with triple the number of long-term care and dementia beds than originally planned.

"Last year, we did a thorough review of all proposed Affordable Supportive Living Initiative (ASLI) projects, and worked with partners like AgeCare to make changes where they were needed to meet the needs of Albertans. Today, we are seeing those results with more than 256 of this facility's units being built at a higher level of care than under the former government's plan, for the same investment." *Brandy Payne, Associate Minister of Health*

The original ASLI agreement for the AgeCare SkyPointe community was for 64 long-term care beds, 32 supportive living 4 dementia beds and 256 Supportive Living 4 beds, a lower level of care. After the government review, the agreement was amended to 128 long-term care beds and 224 Supportive Living 4 Dementia beds. AgeCare is upgrading these spaces for the same grant amount of \$10.56 million. The AgeCare SkyPointe community will serve seniors and other Albertans with daily needs and access to round-the-clock nursing care.

"We are excited to partner with the Alberta government and Alberta Health Services to bring these much needed care beds to Calgary. AgeCare has been designing and building innovative seniors communities for over a decade. Our goal is to provide the best quality of life experience for each individual who chooses to make AgeCare SkyPointe his or her home."

Ron Beirnes



Ron enlisted in the RCAF in late 1950 and was called up on the 04 Jan 1951. Following the training period, he was posted to Trenton as an Aero Engine Tech, stayed for one year then was posted to #1 FW North Luffenham England for 2 years, working on the F86 Sabre. Then was sent to #3 Wing Zweibrucken Germany for 6 months. From there he went to Comox BC as a member of 407 Sqn., working on Lancaster with Maritime Command, which lasted 8.75 years. From there he went to 425 Sqn., working on the CF101 Voodoo, in Bagotville Quebec for 4 years. He again went back to Lahr Germany for 4 years, working on the CF104 Starfighter. After that he went to Cold Lake for three years before taking his release and moving to Calgary where he has remained, so far, for 43 years.
