# City-to-City Conference (Winter)

Living in the City invites you to participate in the conference (in French) Winter Cities for Seniors: How to overcome the barriers to social participation in winter?

Spread out living environments, designed for cars and hostile to pedestrians compromise the active mobility of seniors. The difficulties experienced by many of them are exacerbated in winter. For example, condemned, unplowed sidewalks, poorly cleared of snow or late plowed make it difficult to travel on foot. This can have **a direct impact on the social participation of aging individuals** (e.g., decreased attendance at community centres during the winter).

### **Objectives of the conference:**

- know seniors' perceptions of winter;
- understand seniors' habits during this season;
- Recognize the importance of creating living environments favourable to aging people and the need to adequately maintain pedestrian infrastructure and equipment in winter.
