President's message

It seems only yesterday that we composed a branch newsletter. Actually, it was more than a month ago already. A fair bit has happened since then, enough to end this year by providing a brief update.

Changes to our Branch Board

After many years of faithful service to our branch, most recently as our HBO (Health Benefits Officer), **Donna Wuschke** has decided to retire. She assisted members who had questions related to health care and benefits, including MEDOC travel insurance and the PSHCP (Public Service Health Care Plan). On behalf of the board and of our members, I thank her for her contributions during the years.

I am pleased to announce that **Alanna Wilcox** has agreed to join our board as the new HBO. As a Human Resources expert, Alanna brings a lot of experience to the board and to our branch.

Provincial Election

Although the provincial election resulted in a change of government, the Lac du Bonnet electoral district, where most of our members live, remained Progressive Conservative. Wayne Ewasko remains our elected Member of the Legislative Assembly, but now in opposition. The new NDP government appears to keen to address some of the Provincial health care challenges. In his new role as member of the opposition, Mr Ewasko is now free to criticize, hopefully constructively, the actions of the new government as they pertain to the interests of our members and other seniours.

Advocacy

The Association has appointed Advocacy Program Officers (APOs) in each province. Our previous APO, Cynthia Foreman, has retired from this position and has been replaced by Glenn Armstrong. I met with Glenn in Pinawa in October where we discussed some initiatives for the future, both at the provincial as well as at the federal level. I have written a letter to our MLA, Waye Ewasko, to remind him that our Association has close to 600 members in his electoral district, the priorities of our Association, and that seniors tend to vote in proportionally larger number than other age groups... As we now come closer to the next federal election that has to be held before 2025 October, you can expect to see increased advocacy activity at that level.

Annual General Meeting

The Annual General Meeting (AGM) has been scheduled for Tuesday, April 23, 2024 at the Pinawa Alliance Church. It will start with the traditional buffet lunch at 12:00, followed by a presentation by an invited speaker and concluding with a business meeting. Our Branch Services Coordinator, Paula Nygaard, has tentatively arranged for a speaker from the travel industry, most likely a speaker from Collette Travel. Please pencil in this information in your calendar. The AGM will again be a recruitment meeting, meaning you should try to bring a guest who is eligible for membership.

As most of you are aware, the Association has contracted with selected vendors to give discounts to NAFR members.
