President's message

Welcome to the first and hopefully not last newsletter from your Eastern Manitoba Branch. Winter is officially over, and we look with anticipation to a pleasant spring and summer.

I will start off this brief newsletter with a "State of the Branch". As you know, our branch has been in a precarious situation for six years now because of lack of volunteers to fill some of the key board positions. In that, we are not alone: the Lakeland Branch in Alberta has had to be dissolved for lack of volunteers. The Ottawa Valley Branch had to have a "jolt" and other branches face similar challenges. It is clear that changes to the structure of the Association are needed. For this reason, a "Special Committee on Association Structure" has been struck. I had volunteered to serve on this committee but, since only one member from each district is selected, the outgoing president of the Winnipeg & District branch, Ceci O'Flaherty, who was also one of the main drivers of the formation of this committee, was selected. The expectation is that we will see changes soon that will address these challenges.

Considering this development, and the fact that our branch remains very much viable (six new members so far this year), I have agreed to continue to serve on the board. The preferred role would be past-president to assist a new president but, failing that, as the president for another year. I am pleased to announce that, except for Wendy Berry and Donna Wuschke, all current board members are willing to remain on the board. We badly need additional board members, especially a vice-president and a treasurer. Please email or phone me if you might be able to help in any way. We can provide

training, either in person, on-line, via Zoom, or at regional, district or annual meetings.

Alanna Wilcox, who now looks after health and benefits, has prepared an excellent recruiting document, *Ready to Retire – what you should know.* It is intended for CNL employees at Whiteshell (and Chalk River) who are eligible for even a partial Public Service Pension. We trust that this resource may entice retiring CNL employees to join our branch.

Serving on the Board as an elected officer or director-at-large can be an exciting opportunity. It is a chance to share your expertise and life experiences, add value in advancing the Association's goals and objectives, meet new people and make a difference. Time commitments are not onerous: we have two semi-annual branch meetings and try to limit our board meetings to four or five per year. With a large number of members now living in the Lac du Bonnet and Beausejour areas, we would welcome board members from these two communities. Board members that live outside Pinawa are allowed to charge travel costs to attend board meetings.

The purpose of the Association is to advocate on your behalf, reminding the government to honour the pension you were promised and to fulfill the commitments made to you during your employment. All it takes is a few hours periodically to keep our Branch viable and growing! I strongly encourage you to give some thought to volunteering on the branch board. You can make a difference!

Our 2024 AGM (Annual General Meeting) has been scheduled for Tuesday, April 23 at the Pinawa Alliance Church.
