# **ELECTION MISSION ACCOMPLISHED (MORE OR LESS)**

(The NDP and Conservative candidates were unable to attend.)

The election writs were issued on March 23rd, with Election Day 37 days later.

**OUR MISSION**: To provide public platforms where voters could meet the candidates and hear their ideas.

**OUR CHALLENGE**: Not a lot of time to pull this off.

**OUR STRATEGY**: Call on our trusty volunteers, leverage our connections and experience with allied seniors groups, draw on our 'reserves' to help with expenses, focus on the ridings where most of the Branch members reside: South Surrey-White Rock and the three Langley ridings.

**THE OTHER CHALLENGE**: Getting the candidates to RSVP to our invitations. You would think it would be easier. For those candidates with web-sites, their 'Donate' button and 'Volunteer' button were in working order, the 'Email the candidate' button not so much.

**OUR RESULTS**: Town hall, April 9th, South Surrey-White Rock, St. John's Presbyterian Church, a collaboration with the Semiahmoo Seniors Network, Brella Community Services, and CARP—and Aspira Retirement Living provided the cookies! **Audience**: 120 **Candidates**: Green Party, Christine Kinnie, Liberal Party, Ernie Klassen.
